

Atlantic Basin (Atlantic Ocean, Gulf of Mexico & Caribbean Sea)


15-18 Named Storms7-9 Hurricanes2-3 Major Hurricanes

Issuance of Routine Atlantic Tropical Weather Outlooks beginning May 15!

Although the Atlantic Hurricane season officially begins on June 1st, it is not uncommon for tropical cyclones to form on or prior to that date. To provide more consistent information on the potential for late May and early June systems, NHC will now begin the routine issuance of the Atlantic Tropical Weather Outlook at 8 a.m. EDT on May 15.

The Tropical Weather Outlook is issued every six hours from May 15 through November 30 at 2

a.m., 8 a.m., 2 p.m., and 8 p.m. EDT.

Continuation of an experimental graphical depiction of storm surge inundation values

Graph depicts the expected storm surge inundation values

Value represents peak height the water could reach above normally dry ground somewhere within the specified areas.

Drones that hunt hurricanes – testing underway

NOAA conducted new testing in early January 2021.

Drones fly where hurricane hunter airplanes cannot.

Can fly up to 4 hours and up to 265 miles from point of launch.

Meteorologists could use data to help make evacuation decisions.
